## Solo 56

for solo electric guitar
duration: c. 2'40"

## Notes:

This piece is built of four sections ( $A, B, C \& D$ ), each employing a different mode. It was conceived as a kind of
"Blues" piece, built mainly on the so-called Hindu Pentatonic scale.The root notes of each section use another typi-
cal blues sequence: E, D, A, E.
The scales are as follows:
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Secion A: E Hindu Pentatonic:
Section B: D lydian:
Section C:A Hindu Pentatonic:
Section D:E Hindu Pentatonic:
At the end of each section modulation is implied by "borrowing" notes from the next section, for example in b/4 F\# and $\mathrm{C} \#$ are borrowed from the subsequent D lydian scale which arrives at B .

A clear space should be left between each section - although sounding open strings should be allowed to ring on if appropriate.
A certain flexibility with tempo may also work - I found I'd increase the tempo slightly at B, but with some rubato The melody is paramount, and this should be the performer's focus.
